CHED grants UV Autonomous Status

The Commission on Higher Education has extended the Autonomous Status of the University of the Visayas (UV) for another three years through Memorandum Order No.7 signed by CHED Chairman Prospero de Vera III on September 16.

UV was granted autonomous and deregulated status with validity period for three years from September 16, 2024 to September 15, 2027.

In his memo, De Vera stated that for this cycle of autonomous and deregulated grant, which covers the performance and achievement of Private Higher Education Institutions (PHEIs) all over the country from July 1, 2019 to September 15, 2023, the commission observed several applicants faced challenges in meeting specific indicators due to pandemic-related constraints that affected their achievement/performance in some indicators and in the submission of required evidences.

CHED evaluates PHEIs based on their commitment to program excellence, instructional quality, scholarly work, community engagement, and institutional achievements.

"As these institutions transition from the pandemic to a state of

normalization, these circumstances have been taken into consideration," De Vera added. "However, it is crucial for these institutions to achieve exemplary performance with the requirements of the grant for the renewal of their status once the current validity period expires."

PHEIs that were granted autonomous status enjoy several benefits such as the privilege to offer extension classes, establish linkages with foreign schools, determine and prescribe own curricular programs, offer new programs/courses in the undergraduate or graduate levels, and increase tuition and other school fees without securing a permit from CHED.

They are also exempted from issuance of Special Order (S.O.) for their graduates and from regular monitoring and evaluation of the commission except for violation of laws, rules and regulations.

Moreover, autonomous PHEIs will be prioritized in the grant of subsidies and other financial incentives/assistance from CHED and are given authority to grant honorary degree to deserving individuals and offer programs through alternative modes like distance education, ETEEAP, or transnational education.

What sets UV apart is not only its inclusion in this prestigious list but also its remarkable feat of being one of only 92 private universities in the Philippines to hold an Autonomous Status granted by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED). This honor is a testament to UV's sustained commitment to delivering quality education and fostering institutional innovation.

Adding to its accolades, UV boasts an ISO certification, reinforcing its adherence to global standards in academic and operational excellence.

UV's achievement in the AppliedHE rankings reflects its steadfast dedication to empowering students and contributing to the region's educational and socioeconomic development. ANNUAL REPORT AY 2023-2024



MESSAGE OF THE PRESIDENT

This report to our esteemed stakeholders covers Academic Year 2023-2024. It summarizes the major accomplishments and achievements of the University of the Visayas. This past academic year, we faced numerous challenges and opportunities that unwaveringly tested our strength, resilience and adaptability. Through open communication, deep involvement in operations and having a strategic foresight, our senior leaders guided the organization with integrity and purpose, ensuring that we don't only navigated these changes but emerged stronger and more united. Our pursuit of excellence for the year under review yielded major accomplishments. We received several recognitions from the Commission on Higher Education, in particular the award as an AUTONOMOUS STATUS. UV was also certified as a deputized higher education institute under the Expanded Tertiary Education Equivalency and Accreditation Program (ETEEAP) for, Business Administration, Engineering, Architecture, Education, Criminology, and Office Administration.

In April 29-30, 2024, UV was recertified for its Quality Management System by TUV NORD with the award of ISO 9001:2015 certification. The University has made significant milestones in complying with accreditation standards, reflecting its commitment to provide quality education. Our continuous quest for accreditation during the year under review has yielded several results: namely: UV made substantial progress in accreditation, with five undergraduate programs achieving Level 4 accreditation status, and 14 graduate and undergraduate programs are now accredited. Likewise, the Student Records and Management Department enhanced its processes to ensure efficient graduation procedures and release of transcript of academic records during the Commencement Exercises. Student Affairs and Services

Center initiated numerous programs addressing mental health, leadership and social responsibility. Program accreditation, the deployment of Quality Assurance Review and Planning, compliance with regulatory requirements, infrastructure investments and alignment to 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals are all in-placed in order to contribute with the UN 2030 goals.

Research is the primary mission of the university. Our research has produced several outputs including research grants from CHED while several researches were published in journals. There were several faculty members who presented papers in various conferences and research locally and internationally. The Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines awarded UV Bronze Award for its Intellectual Property initiatives.

Quality teaching and learning includes compliance with the required minimum academic qualifications of faculty members, meeting the expected performance evaluation, membership of professional organizations, advisership tasks, faculty ranking, curriculum validation and evaluation, board examination performances, external certification, National Certification program, Quality Circles, International English Language Certification, learning management system implementation as well as employability.

In the context of our vision statement, our commitment to internationalization enhances our academic environment and enriches the student experience. Through strategic partnerships with international universities, and diverse cultural initiatives, we are fostering a global perspective among our students and other stakeholders. This initiative not only prepares our graduates to thrive in an interconnected world but also strengthens our university's position as a leader in global education. To date, there are 215 international students coming from 21 countries who are enrolled in the various undergraduate and

graduate programs in the university. There is a slight increase in the number of enrolled international students compared to AY 2022-2023.

Likewise, embracing internationalization signifies the alignment of our learning outcomes in the curriculum as required by the industries. One is the adoption of the International English Language Certification by both students, faculty members and non-teaching personnel. By passing such and by attaining a certain level, they are now globally ready to work in another country. Semester-by-semester, UV produces passers of TOEIC examination. The university has considered the importance of industry linkages, which enhance our academic programs and provide students with real-world experience. By collaborating with local businesses and organizations, we ensure our curriculum remains relevant and aligned with industry needs, ultimately preparing our graduates for successful careers. The university has local and global partnerships, through MOU/MOA signing in order to strengthen its link to the industry.

For relevance and responsiveness, we have continued to provide training and extension services to our adopted community. Our commitment to community involvement, highlighting initiatives that foster collaboration and support local needs. There are 23 community extension activities being conducted in 2023 to the adopted community and not to mention other outreach projects being carried-out. This engagement not only enriches our students' experiences but also reflects our dedication to social responsibility. Looking forward, we continue to touch base with our adopted community so UV can do a lot more. Our commitment to save the environment has taken another step with the implementation of the University Green Productivity Program through the deployment of the 5 S program.

The Quality Management System continues to be applied in day-to-day operations through various feedback mechanisms such as the Quality Circles, Best Innovative Procedures Award (BIPA), customer feedback mechanism, 5S and the Knowledge Based Management System. We continue to enhance our various ISO manuals by documenting procedures and policies for the guidance of all concerned.

There was a remarkable increase in our freshman enrollment for AY 2023-2024 compared to AY 2022-2023 for various programs. Total enrollment also went up this year compared to last year. The increase in the enrollment can also be attributed to the preparation of roadmaps of the different colleges, thus the submission of the marketing plans. The creativity and strategic mindset of our senior leaders demonstrate our collective commitment to enhancing UV's visibility and outreach in our existing market. These marketing plans played a crucial role in attracting prospective students, retaining existing students and showcasing the unique offerings of UV.

Among the competency programs being offered in UV are: Housekeeping NC II, Food and Beverage Services NC II and Bread and Pastry Production NC II, all with validity up to 2029. Moreover, UV was able to receive the Certificate of Accreditation as a Competency Assessment Center for the following programs: Shielded Metal Arc Welding (SMAW) NC I, Shielded Metal Arc Welding (SMAW) NC II, Food and Beverage NC II, Tourism Promotion Services NC II, Bread and Pastry Production NC II, Housekeeping NC II, Bookkeeping NC III, Travel Services NC II and Cookery NC II, all with validity up to 2025.

UV continued to excel in academics and student competitions. The school has sent teams to various competitions in regional and national curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular, athletic and artistic competitions and has brought home a significant number of championships and top three places.

Learning management system was implemented coupled with other innovative instructional styles were introduced to enrich the curriculum delivery. These are quite critical as innovative teaching is a function of effective learning. These initiatives resulted to one board examination topper from the College of Education and a placer in the regional board examination as administered by the Board of Criminology. Passing in the licensure exams is one of our major concerns with UV getting 100% passing rate in Criminology program, UV among the top schools in Region 7. In the main campus, 46% of programs including Criminology, Nursing, Education, Pharmacy and Accountancy, exceeded national passing rates. Toledo and Dalaguete campuses also exceeded the national passing rates, with Dalaguete earning recognition as a performing school for its Bachelor of Elementary Education program in the country. These accomplishments and achievements were made by our valuable human resource, our academic officials, administrators, faculty, and staff. They have given their utmost cooperation, support and commitment to realize the vision and mission of our institution.

University of the Visayas continues to provide high quality education as living proof of the founder's dream and as our humble contribution to nation-building, the legacy of Don Vicente Gullas, UV's 1st President who nurtured our great institution from its humble beginnings. It is the promise of your continued support that inspires us to go beyond the limits of that dream and legacy. With the guidance and leadership of our Executive Board, the cooperation, dedication and loyalty of our Executive Officers, Academic and Administration officers, Deans, Principals, program coordinators, teaching and non-teaching staff and our primary stakeholders, the students, UV will continue to scale greater heights. UV receives over 12-M CHED grant on Global English project



The University of the Visayas (UV) has been granted 12,750,000-peso grant from the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) to undertake a project on Global English Competitiveness Development program for one year.

UV has partnered with the Centro Escolar University (CEU) and Lyceum of the Philippines University-Batangas Campus (LPU-Batangas) as well as with the Government Academic Industry Network, Inc. (GAIN) for the completion of the said project.

The project aimed to produce GEC modules for college students based from the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) levels B2 and C1.

There were 45 CEFR-based modules produced with each module consisting of four (4) lessons or a total of 180 lessons in English covering the four macro skills, namely: listening, reading, writing and speaking.

Of the 45 English modules produced, 30 covered B1 to B2 levels of English proficiency while the other 15 modules focused on C1 level.

CEFR-based language proficiency level

According to the British Council, the CEFR has six levels, from A1 for beginners up to C2. For each level, the CEFR describes what a learner can do when speaking, reading, listening and writing in English.

B1 learners (Intermediate Level) are those who can understand information about familiar topics as well as those who can communicate in most situations whilst travelling in an English-speaking area. In addition, B1 learners can write simple connected texts on familiar topics.

Meanwhile, B2 learners (Upper Intermediate) are those learners who can understand the main ideas of complex texts. B2 learners can interact with some fluency and communicate easily aside from being able to write clear, detailed texts on a wide range of topics and express their opinions.

On the other hand, C1 learners (Advanced) are those learners who can understand a wide range of long, complex texts as well as being able to interact and express themselves fluently and spontaneously and use language flexibly and effectively in social, academic and professional situations.

All the modules along with the multi-media outputs shall be made available to all learners in the Philippines as open educational resources in English language which can be accessed through YouTube and other platforms.

Furthermore, the project also targeted to produce a research output based from the pilot testing of the modules to the students of the three universities through the conduct of an international standardized English language test, particularly the Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC).

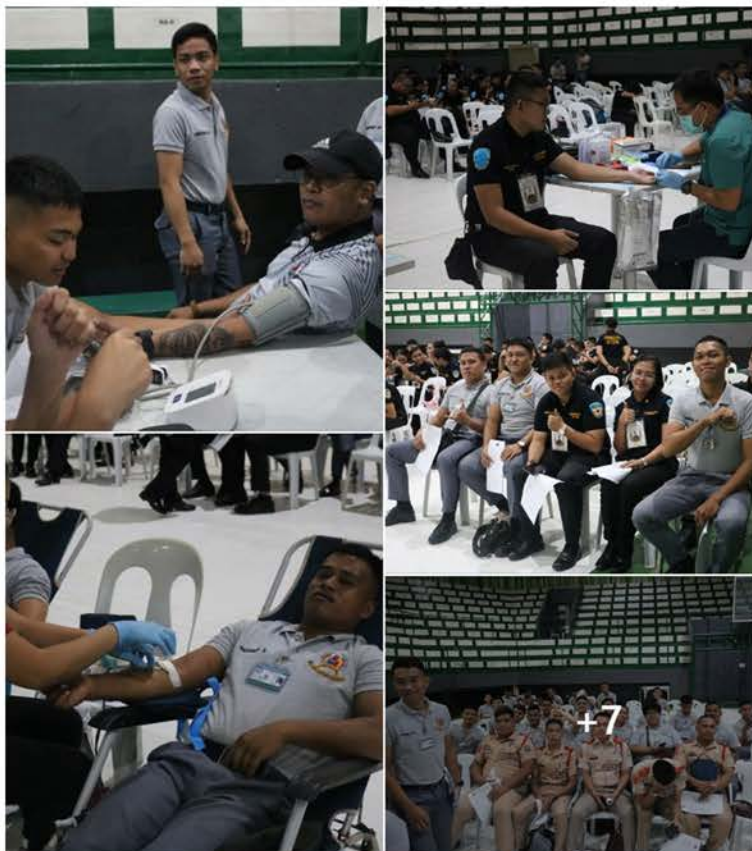

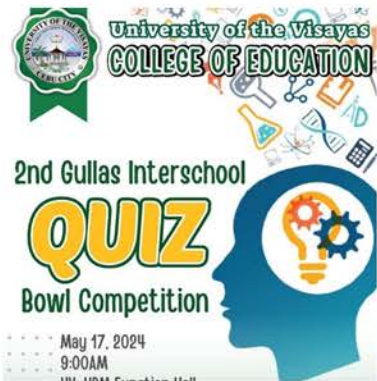
COED Days Celebrated

UV-Gullas Law School makes history with successive wins at 3rd CHR Inter-Law School debate tournament

Actio Popularis, the first ever debate team of the Gullas Law School-International Law Students Alliance (GLD-ILSA) of the University of the Visayas (UV), made their debut in the debating scene a memorable one after pulling off historic wins on the way to finish second overall in the 3rd Inter-Law School Human Rights Debate Tournament staged last November 9-10 at the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) Office in Quezon City.

Named after a class action suit in human rights cases, Actio Popularis is composed of Joshua Tambor (Necessity), Ara Mai Allego (Beneficiality), and Adin Jhon Ligsanan (Practicability) who were all tied as 4th Best Speakers.

They're under the guidance of esteemed coaches from the GLS-ILSA namely Atty. Eunice Baliong and Atty. Vertillano Relevo V, who are both professors teaching Public International Law and Constitutional Law, respectively.

"If law is to serve humanity, legal education must go beyond theory. It must not remain confined within the walls of the school. Laws must withstand the test of reality," said Relevo. "At UV GLS, we seek opportunities for students to bring their legal knowledge to bear in society."

"To the talented debaters, Joshua, Adin, and Ara, you made UV GLS and ILSA proud. We are grateful for your passion and dedication. We are excited for the future of UV-GLS and ILSA," Relevo added.

Actio Popularis kicked off their campaign with a decisive win over the Batangas State University (BSU) in the opening round.

Arguing for the affirmative on the motion, "This house would, as a third-world country, ignore the calls of the international community in pursuing climate action and would prioritize its own development," the spirited Visayanians outwitted the Batangueños when they emphasized with savvy the common but differentiated responsibilities of states in fulfilling their international environmental law obligations.

Sustaining their momentum, they outsmarted the University of Mindanao (UM) in the second round on the motion, "This house believes that women should be the sole decision maker in medical termination of pregnancy."

Pleading on the affirmative, Actio Popularis swept past their UM rivals by



building their framework on Article II, Section 14 of the Constitution, on the State's duty to recognize the role of women in nation-building and mandating the State to uphold gender equality, which includes respecting women's decisions regarding their own bodies

As action heated up in the third round, so was the line of argumentation of the GLS top bets on the way to besting the University of Sto. Tomas (UST) on the motion, "This house would remove the party-list system rather than reform it." Contending for the negative this time, Actio Popularis held their ground during a heated exchange and display of legal prowess against UST for their third straight victory that vaulted them to the quarterfinals of the fierce debate competition that was participated in by 24 law schools all over the country.

Their rationalization perfectly spotlighted the marriage of constitutional law and international law when they invoked Article XIII, Section 16 of the Constitution on the non-abridgment of the right of the people to effective and reasonable participation at all levels of social, political, and economic decision-making, along with the Philippines' treaty obligations under the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) and the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR) on the right of indigenous peoples to participate in decision-making, highlighting the necessity of inclusive legislative representation.

"I am incredibly proud of our team's debate victory. Their hard work and skills highlight the dedication and talent of our institution, showing the potential and bright future our students are building. This win truly reflects our shared commitment to excellence," said UV-GLS Dean Atty. Darling Chyrmith Wagas-Estorgio

As the only representative of Central Visayas, the remarkable performance of Actio Popularis underscores GLS-ILSA's commitment to contribute to the appreciation and awareness of international human rights law in the region. Moreover, as the region's first to establish a Center for Human Rights Education, UV plays a key role in promoting human rights awareness and education.



A Monumental first in Gullas Law School History: The Don Vicente Mock Trial Competition

The inaugural Don Vicente Mock Trial is where the sharp legal minds of the 3rd Year Evidence Class and the 4th Year Practice Court Class took center stage.

This year's mock trial revolves around a fictional rape case designed to challenge the participants' understanding of criminal law and remedial law. The case involves the Accused, portrayed by Ivan Briones, who allegedly committed the crime against a medical student, played by Angelica Hudierrez. The 3rd Year Evidence students assumed the role of the prosecution, while the 4th Year Practice Court students faced the painstaking task of defending the accused. Both teams gave their best and performed exceptionally well. However, a winner and a verdict had to be decided. The competition was presided over by Atty. Renato Galeon, a sought-after expert litigator, with a distinguished panel of judges consisting of Atty. Rehne Gibb Larena, Atty. Jerald Macabaya, and Atty. Adrienne O. Tirado, all of whom are experienced

litigators. After careful deliberation, the Defense team was declared the winner based on their superior performance. Yet, the presiding judge handed down a guilty verdict, reflecting the strength of the prosecution's evidence—a testament to the fierce and cutthroat nature of the competition. Gullas Law School mooting team debuts at The Hague, Netherlands

In a historic first, the University of the Visayas – Gullas Law School launched its first and only moot court and debate team, the Gullas Law School – International Law Students Alliance [GLS-ILSA]. GLS-ILSA made its moot court debut at the recently concluded eleventh edition of the IBA-ICC Moot Court Competition which ran from 31 May 2024 to 7 June 2024 at Leiden University, Den Haag, The Hague, Netherlands, with the final rounds held at no less than the International Criminal Court at The Hague, Netherlands.

GLS-ILSA is among the eleven new teams joining the competition for the very first time. It is also the first and only university in Cebu to compete and represent the region to the prestigious international competition.

The team is composed of speakers and counsels, Rainiel Launderes, Merit Adrian dela Victoria, Kyle Louis Lizarondo along with researchers, Dorothy Therese Ortega and Cherry Ann Velasco. At the helm, leading the team is GLS-ILSA's coach, Atty. Eunice Baliong and Assistant Coach, Dean Joseph Randi Torregosa.

The IBA-ICC Moot Court Competition is an extensive educational and social program, which brings together students of diverse backgrounds and cultures from around the world to The Hague to challenge their skills as future international lawyers before panels of legal experts in the field of international criminal law. It is organized by the International Bar Association [IBA] in partnership with Leiden University and the International Criminal Court [ICC]. Each year, student-teams are presented with a case involving a fictitious situation before the ICC. The student-teams represent the interests of all parties--Prosecution, Defense, and Victims--both in writing and through pleadings before a panel of legal experts.

GLS-ILSA finished its debut run, ranking 55th out of 114 teams from different law schools and universities around the world.

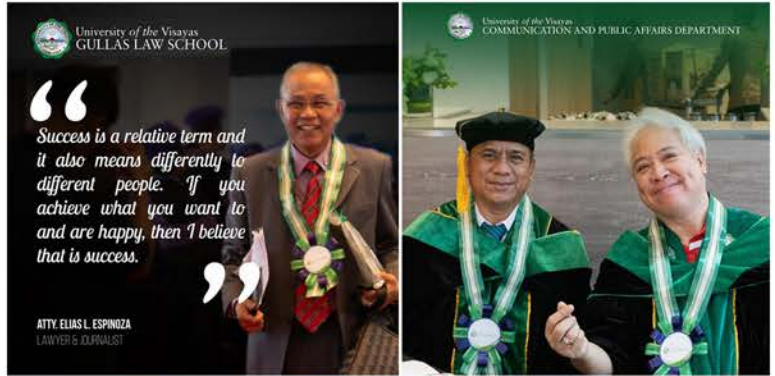


GLS Celebrates 105th Commencement with On-the-Spot Diploma Issuance and Inspiring Send-Off for Class of 2024

GLS co-hosts forum on advancing the interests of an archipelagic nation

In partnership with the University of the Visayas - Gullas Law School, the Integrated Bar of the Philippines - Cebu City Chapter, and the Philippines Councilors League - Province of Cebu, Waypoints hosted a successful forum titled “Kasiguraduhan sa Karagatan: A Discussion on Advancing the Interests of an Archipelagic Nation” on September 26, 2024, at the University of the Visayas.

The forum's agenda covered critical topics in two sessions. The morning session focused on civil maritime security, the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), the 2016 Arbitral Award, relevant domestic legislation, and marine pollution in the Philippines. The afternoon session presented a GEDSI-centered analysis of Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated Fishing (IUUF) and a panel discussion on Coastal Resource Management.

In his welcome address, Atty. Joseph Randi Torregosa, Dean of the University of the Visayas School of Law, highlighted the essential yet often overlooked issue of marine rights and security, describing it as both vital and frequently marginalized.

Mr. Julio S. Amador III, Senior Adviser of Waypoints, presented the civil maritime security report, outlining recommendations in four categories: strategic policy and legislative frameworks, the complex system of regulators and enforcers, capacity-building needs, and preemptive regulation policies. He stressed the urgent need to pass the Maritime Zones (MZ) Act, which would provide a clear foundation for managing and protecting the Philippines' maritime resources.

Mr. Kristoffer Guiller Lamug, Senior Program Officer of Waypoints, discussed maritime security in the Philippines, addressing traditional threats like terrorism alongside nontraditional threats, such as climate change and food insecurity. He underscored the importance of integrating a civilian perspective into national security strategies.

In a keynote on behalf of Acting Mayor Atty. Raymund Alvin N. Garcia, Mr. Ed Karlon N. Rama, Executive Assistant to the Mayor, outlined Cebu City's approach to maritime governance, including programs like the Cebu City Bantay Dagat, Reef Rehabilitation Initiative, and Coastline Management Board to promote sustainability.

Atty. Torregosa set the tone for discussions on elevating marine rights and security in public discourse, emphasizing their importance for protecting the Philippines' maritime assets. Atty. Neil Silva discussed the impact of UNCLOS, the 2016 Arbitral Award, and the Maritime Zones Bill, underscoring that the bill aligns with UNCLOS and reinforces the 2016 award against China's "nine-dash line" claims in the South China Sea.

Mr. Deryk Baladjay, Marine Pollution Research Lead, reported on marine pollution in the Philippines, identifying plastic as the primary source of coastal pollution. He recommended strengthening waste management policies, including establishing Municipal Environment and Natural Resource Offices (MENROs) and Barangay Solid Waste Councils.

Dr. Rosalie Arcala Hall presented her findings on Gender Equality, Disability, and Social Inclusion (GEDSI) in IUUF, highlighting the complex dynamics between commercial and small-scale fishers and the distinct roles of men and women in the fishing industry.

The panel discussion featured experts, including Mr. Lorenz Gideon F. Esmero from DENR 7, Atty. Benjamin A. Cabrido Jr. from the IBP Cebu City Chapter, Mr. Ed Karlon N. Rama of Cebu City Bantay Dagat, and Mr. Albert Simbajon Jr. from BFAR-7. The panel underscored the importance of community involvement in Coastal Resource Management and recommended enhancing marine conservation through protected areas and empowering bantay-dagat initiatives.

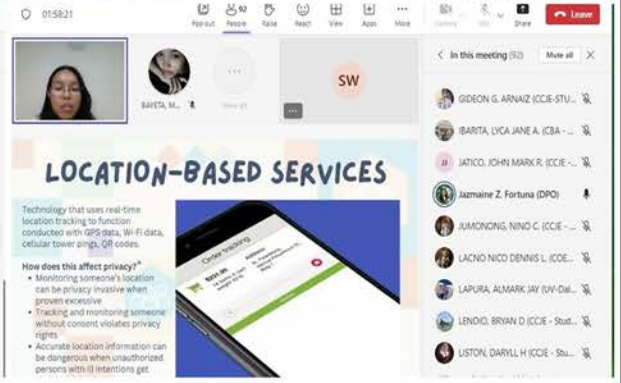
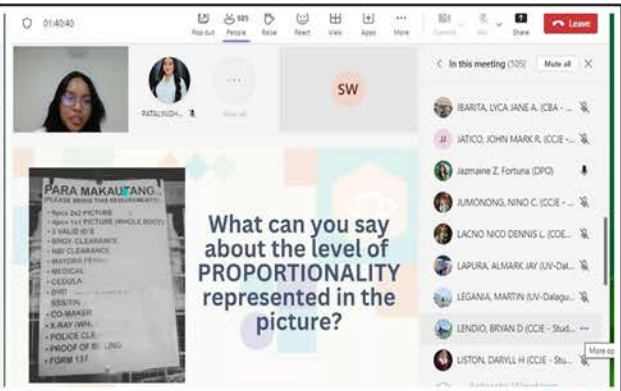
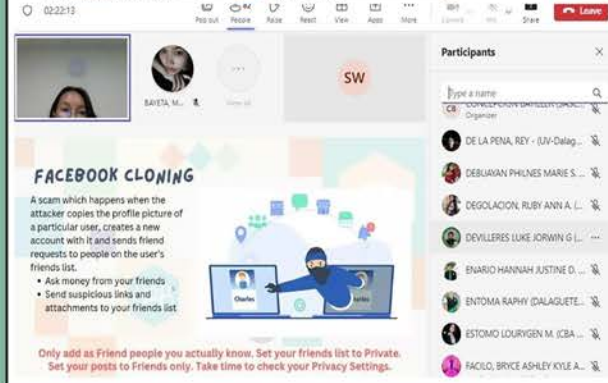
The seminar successfully served as a platform to raise awareness, educate, and empower the university community to actively engage in the prevention and elimination of sexual harassment in all its forms.

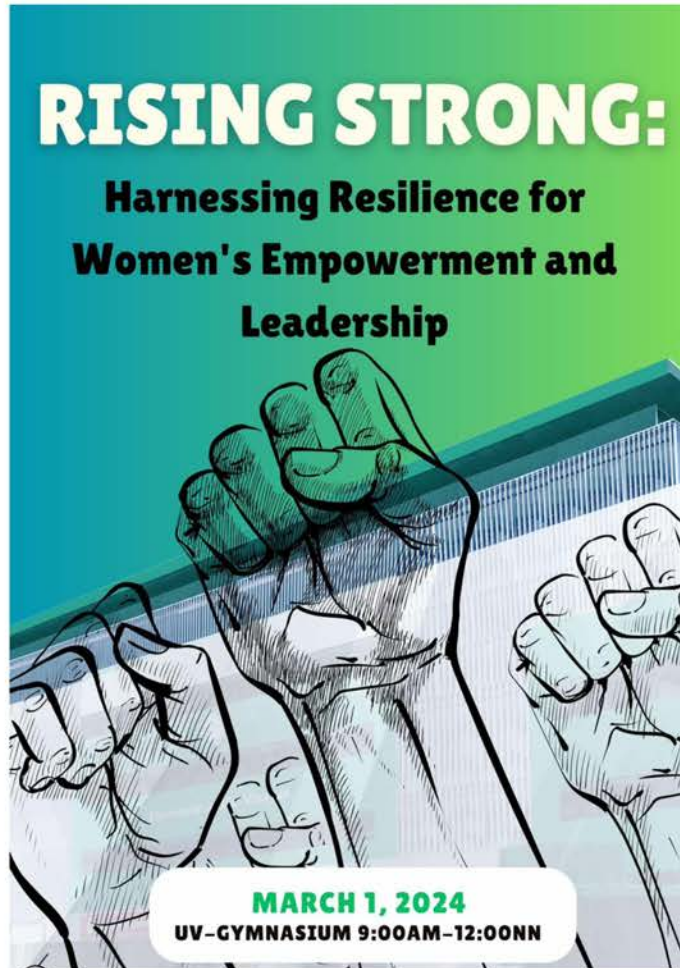

Halad Pasalamat Year 10: A Success

Cebu City, February 3, 2024 – The University of the Visayas (UV) celebrated the 10th anniversary of its annual "Halad Pasalamat" event, a Day of Thanksgiving and Prayer that brings together the community for a wide array of essential services. Held every first Saturday of February at the UV Main Campus, this year's event saw a tremendous turnout, with numerous beneficiaries receiving medical, non-medical, and legal services, as well as government agencies and private partners.

The medical services offered were comprehensive and well-received. The event saw 270 individuals receiving flu vaccines and 109 receiving pneumococcal vaccines, both facilitated by the Cebu City Health Department (CCHD). Additional health services included urine micral tests for 57 individuals, bone screening and cholesterol tests for 26 people, and uric and cholesterol tests for 36 beneficiaries, thanks to the efforts of Zydus Pharmaceutical and Healol Pharma Corporation. Random blood sugar tests were provided to 24 participants, while 107 individuals benefitted from eye consultations by Focal Sight. The Philippine Guidance Association-Cebu Chapter offered social support and mental health services to 16 beneficiaries, and the Department of Veterinary Medicine and Fisheries provided veterinary services to 22 attendees.

Beyond healthcare, the event also featured a variety of non-medical services. A jobs fair, supported by companies such as Aerophone, BDO Unibank, Inc., Concentrix, Outsource, Qualfon, Multi Stores Corporation (SM Stores), Virginia, International Pharmaceuticals, Inc., Author Solutions, Inc., and the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), assisted 28 job seekers. Legal aid was provided to 54 individuals by the Gullas Institute of Legal Aid Services. The College of Maritime Education conducted a marine environmental awareness session for 32 participants. Massage services were popular, with dry back massages provided to 112 individuals by the Department of Manpower Development and Placement, wet massages to 123 beneficiaries by the International Pharmaceutical Inc. Foundation, and reflexology to 170 individuals by Cardinal Vidal Foot Reflex and Body Massage. Pundok Kadasig offered shoe repair services to 76 attendees, and the Philippine Army provided haircuts to 142 people.

Government agencies played a crucial role in the event, offering vital services to the community. The Land Transportation Office conducted a theoretical driving course and issued student permits to 100 individuals. The National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) serviced 38 people, while the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) and the Social Security System (SSS) each assisted 59 beneficiaries. Pag-IBIG provided services to 51 individuals, including online registration for first-time members, assistance with Virtual Pag-IBIG, MP2 registration, and addressing general queries.

The 10th Halad Pasalamat highlighted UV's unwavering commitment to community service, health, and well-being. The success of this event underscores the importance of collaboration between educational institutions, private companies, and government agencies in fostering community support and development. This milestone event not only provided much-needed services but also strengthened the bond between the university and the Cebuano community, paving the way for future initiatives of gratitude and service.

The University of the Visayas-Dalaguete Campus has launched an Artificial Intelligence (AI) Coding and Robotics Training program for Senior High School students during the school year 2023-2024. 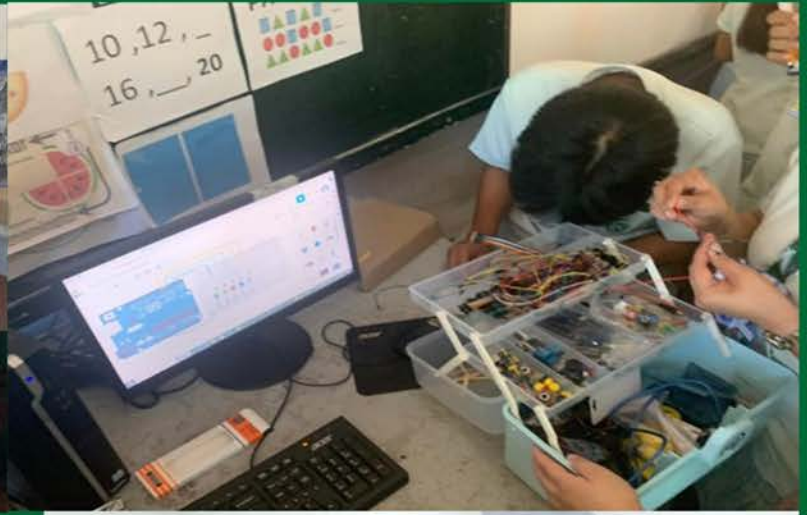

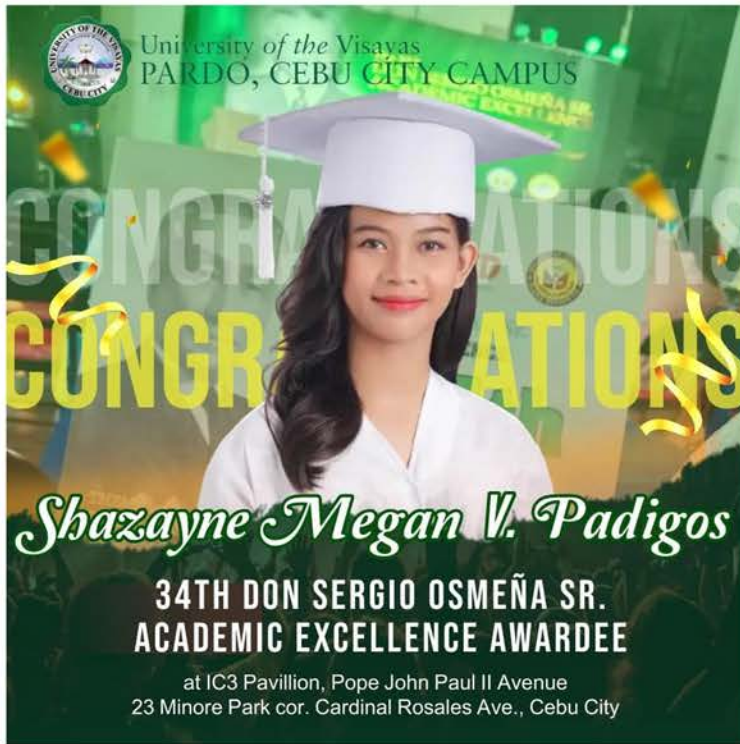
